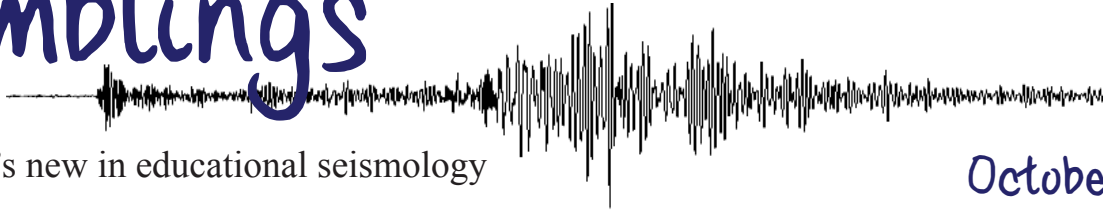

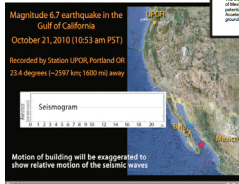
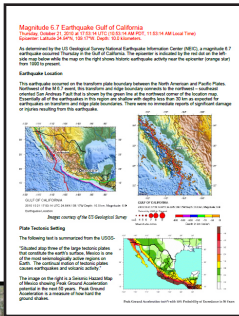


...what's new in educational seismology

M6.7 Earthquake!

On October 21st, a magnitude 6.7 earthquake in the Gulf of California was well recorded across our educational network. A 'Teachable Moment' PDF and animation was created for this earthquake and is available in both English and Spanish.



Teachable Moments are created for newsworthy earthquakes greater than approximately magnitude 7.0. They include a suite of products including short pdf presentations, animations, and powerpoints. These resources are available within a few hours to one day after the earthquake.

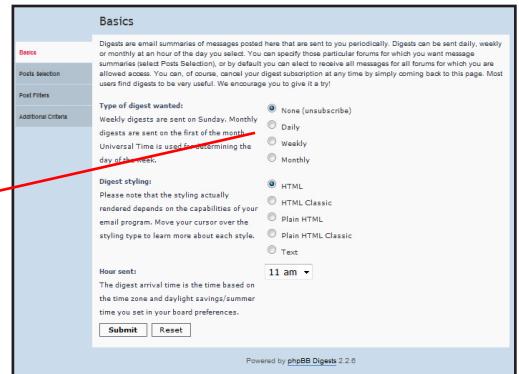
Re-Launching the Forum

Alternatively, the forum now has the functionality for users to be notified of forum activity using a digest (daily or weekly summaries). Preferences for the digest can be set by selecting 'User Preferences' then the 'Digests' tab.
